## 2. INTRODUCTION

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### 2.1 OVERVIEW

Welcome to the Autenti Connector for Creatio user guide. It's for Creatio administrators and business users, and covers configuration, sending documents for e-signature through the Autenti API, and monitoring signature status in Creatio.

### 2.2 PREREQUISITES

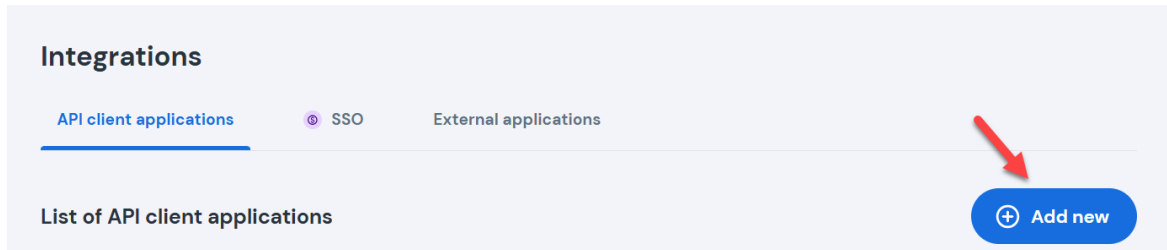
Before you begin make sure you meet the following requirements:

1. You have an **active Autenti account/subscription** with API access and credentials.
2. You have a **Creatio environment with permissions** to install Marketplace applications and run business processes.
3. The Autenti Connector for Creatio depends on the following **Creatio apps** - ensure they're **installed** in your environment:
  - Customer 360
  - Order and Contract Management

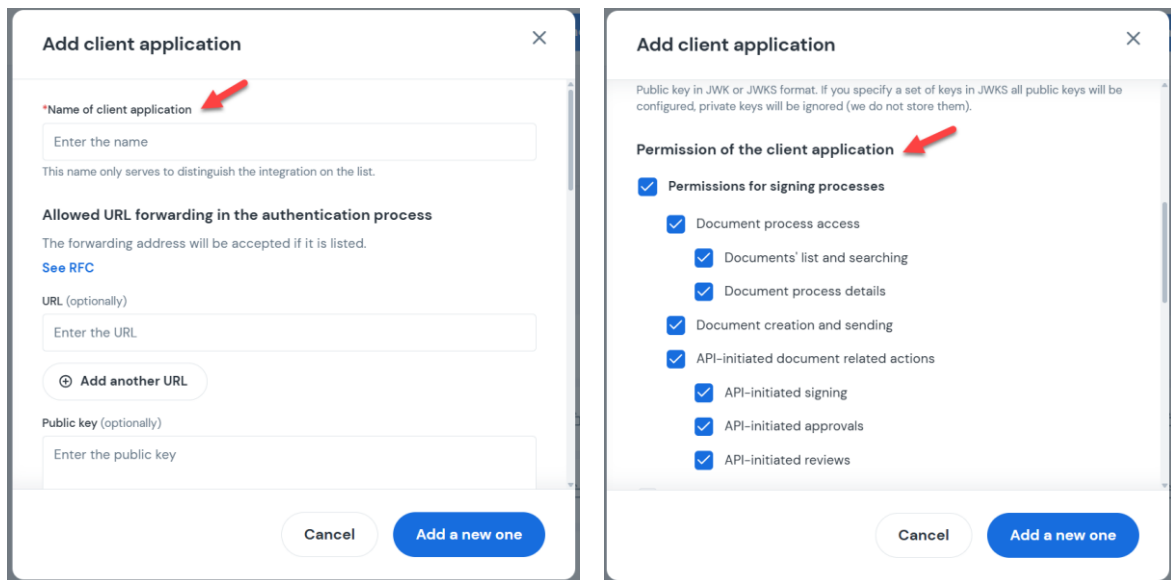
## 3. GETTING STARTED

### 3.1 CREATE API CLIENT IN AUTENTI ACCOUNT

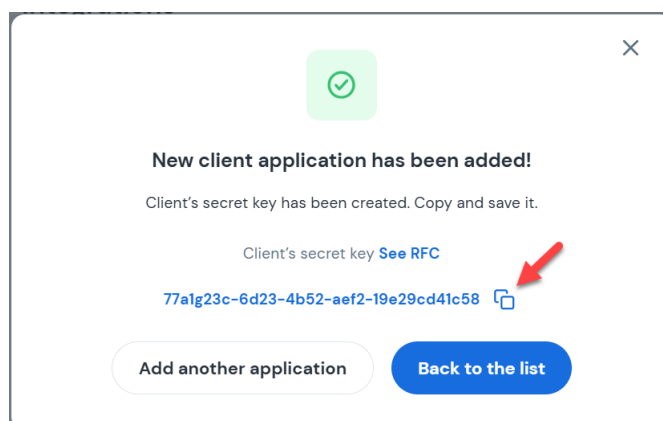
1. Sign in to your Autenti account and open [Integration settings](#).
2. Click **Add new**.



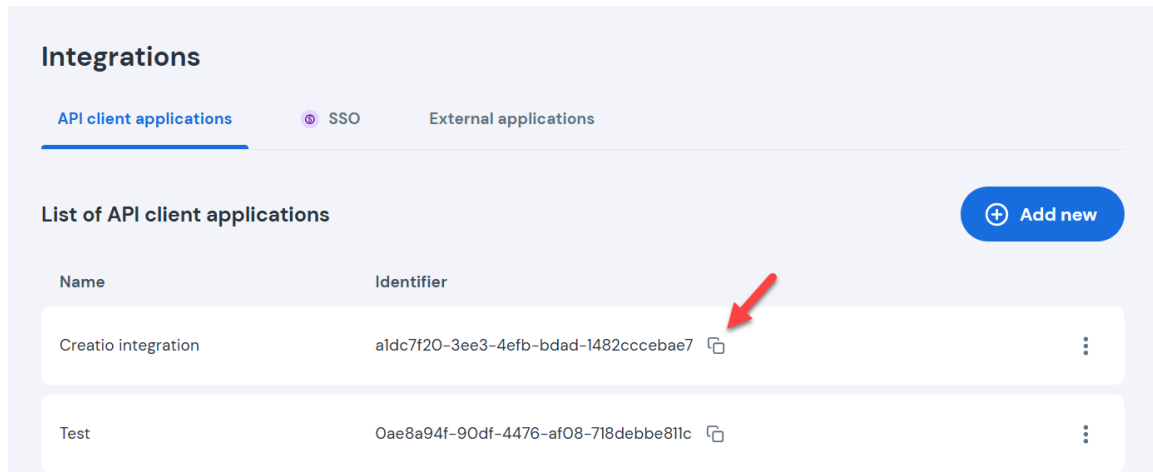
3. In the form:
  - a. Enter a **Name of client application**.
  - b. In **Permissions**, select **Permissions for signing processes** and include API-initiated document-related actions.



4. Click **Add a new one** to create the client.
5. Copy the **Client secret key**. Store it securely – you won't be able to view it again.



- Return to the API clients list and copy the **Client application ID** (shown as **Identifier** in the list).



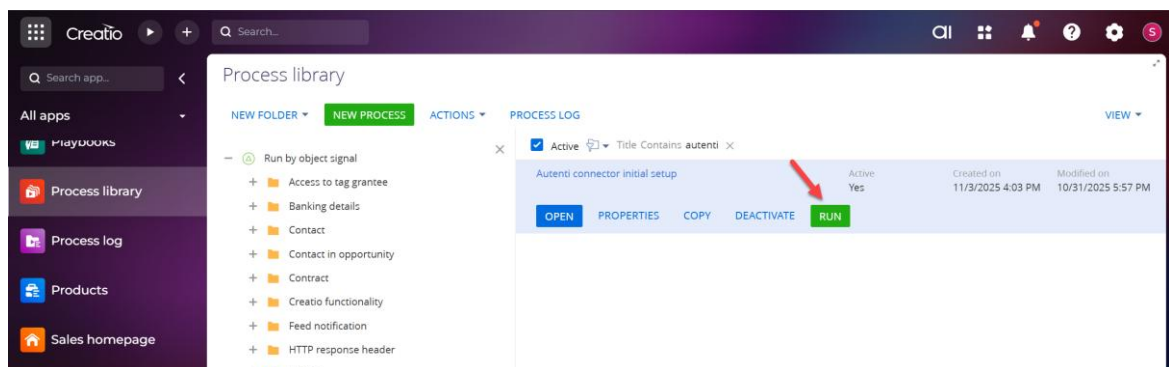
**NOTE:** You'll need these later during Creatio setup:

- Client application ID
- Client secret key

## 3.2 CONFIGURE AUTENTI CONNECTOR

You can configure the Autenti Connector via a business process.

- Open **Process library**.
- Run **Autenti connector initial setup** process.



- In the form provide:
  - Autenti API URL.**

Production URL:

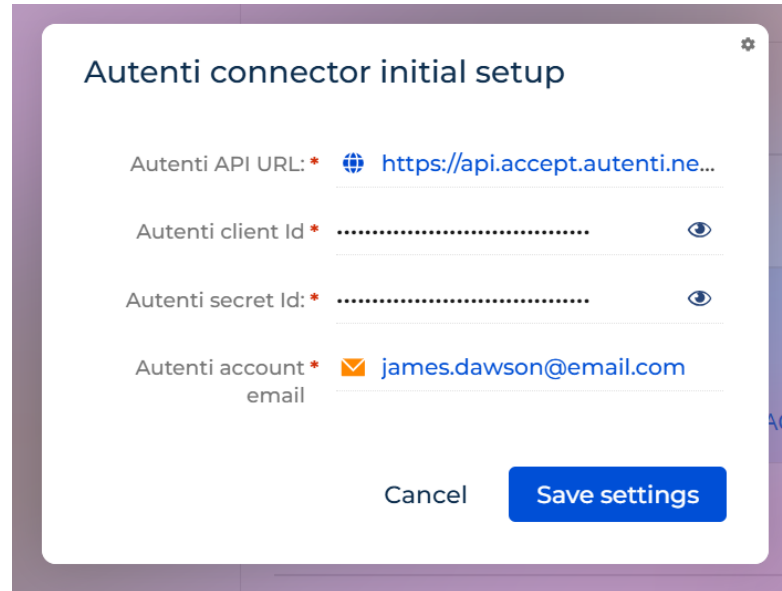

**NOTE:** Production and test are separate Autenti instances. Ensure your API client was created in the same environment you enter here.

- b. **Autenti client Id** (see **Client application ID** from [Create API client in Autenti account](#)).
- c. **Autenti secret Id** (see **Client secret key** from [Create API client in Autenti account](#)).
- d. **Autenti account email** (the email linked to your Autenti account).
- e. Click **Save settings** to update Creatio configuration (all values are stored as system parameters).

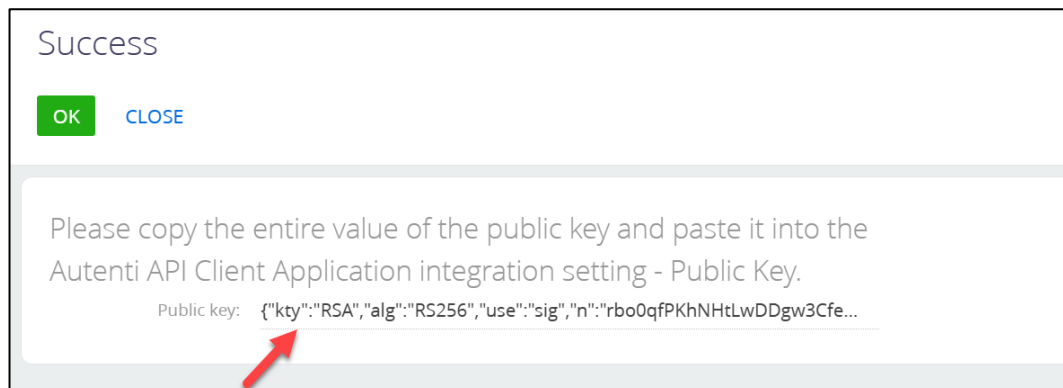

4. On the success message, a **Public key** is displayed. Copy **the entire value** and store it securely—you won't be able to view it again.

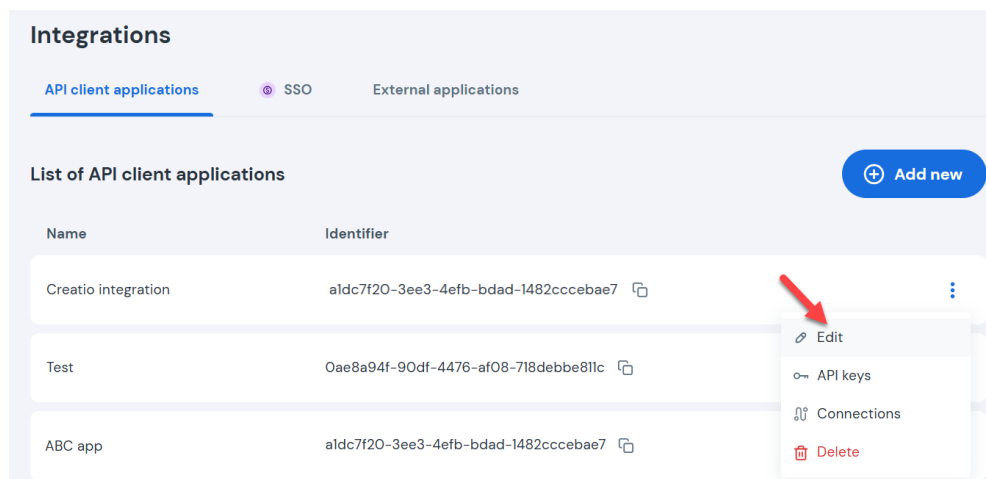
5. Click **OK** to complete the setup.

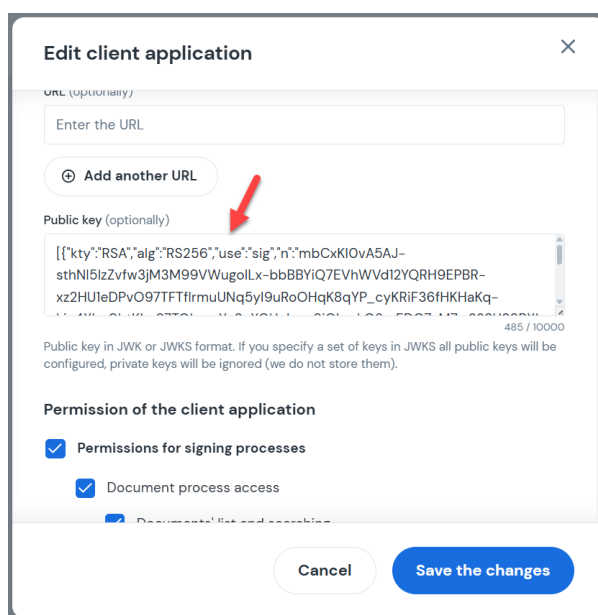

### 3.3 CONFIGURE API CLIENT IN AUTENTI ACCOUNT

1. Sign in to your Autenti account and open [Integration settings](#).
2. For the API client you created earlier, open the three-dot menu and click Edit.



3. In the form:
  - a. Paste your **Public key** value from Creatio into the **Public key** field.

## 4. SENDING DOCUMENTS FOR E-SIGNATURE

### 4.1 WHAT'S AN ENVELOPE?

The Autenti Connector for Creatio uses an object called **an envelope** - a container for a single e-signature transaction. An envelope bundles everything Autenti needs to run the signing flow, including:

- Document to be signed
- Participant (signer) and their role

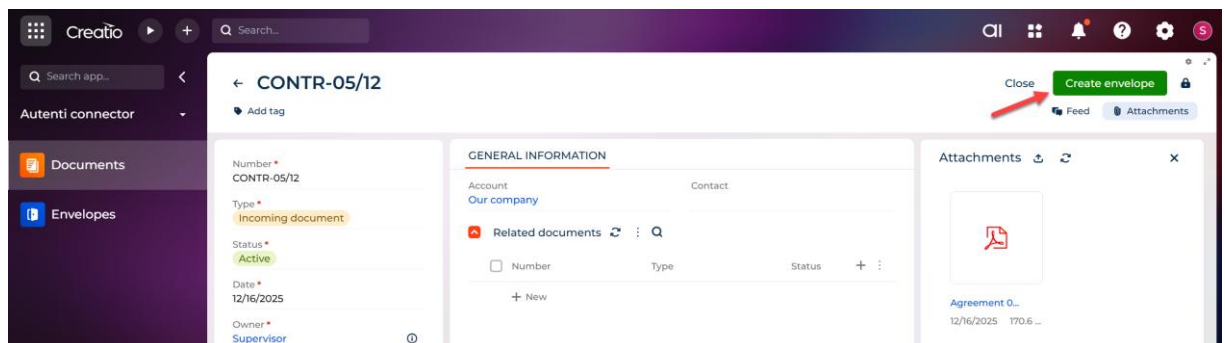
### 4.2 FREE EDITION LIMITATIONS

The free edition currently supports one document and one participant per envelope. 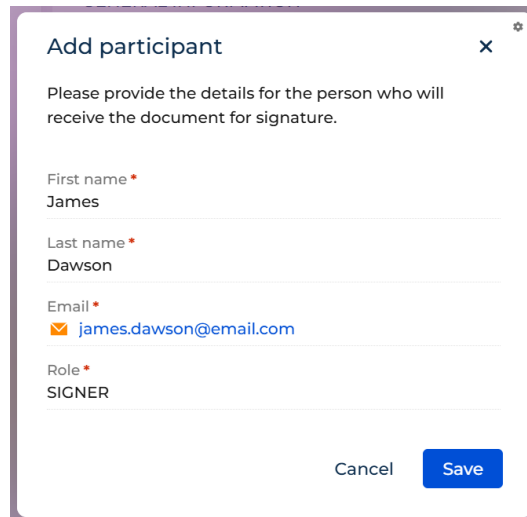
### 4.3 CREATE AN ENVELOPE

1. Open the Document record in Creatio.
2. Upload a file to the document. **Create envelope** button is enabled after a file is uploaded.

**NOTE:** Autenti accepts files with the following extensions: PDF, DOC, DOCX, ODS, ODT, XLS, XLSX.



3. Click **Create envelope**.
4. In the **Participant** form, enter:
  - a. **First name**
  - b. **Last name**
  - c. **Email**
  - d. **Role** is set to **SIGNER** by default.

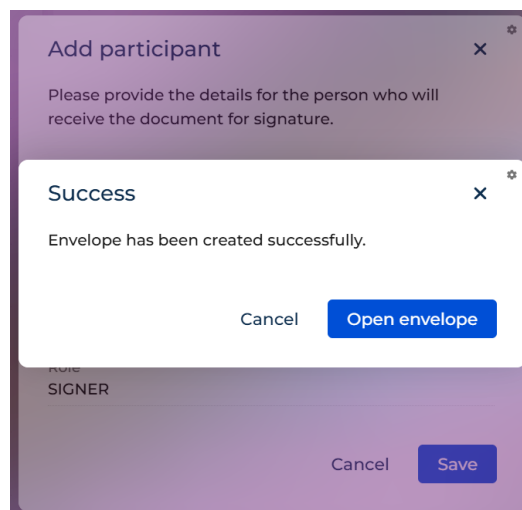

- Click **Save**. A dialog appears – choose **Open envelope** to navigate to the new envelope, or **Cancel** to stay on the document.

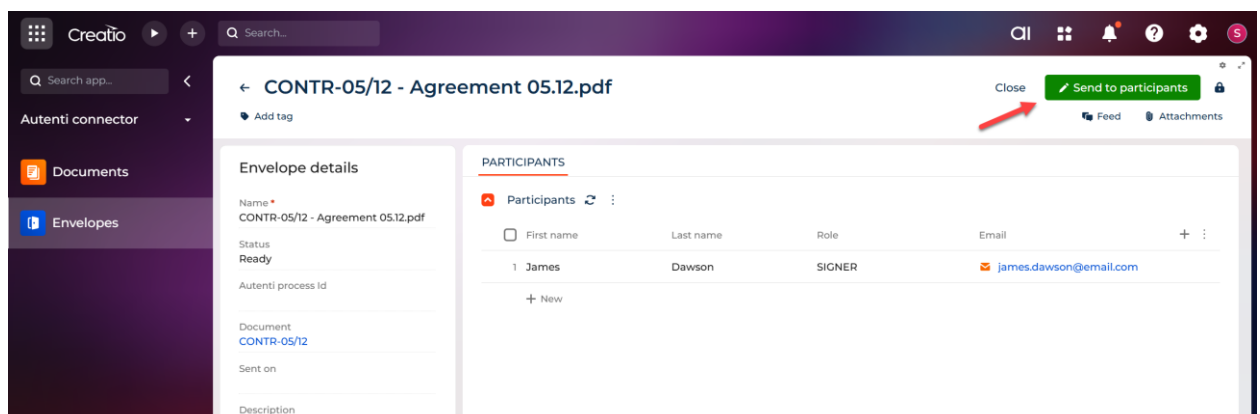

## 4.4 SEND TO PARTICIPANTS

- Open the envelope in **Ready** status.



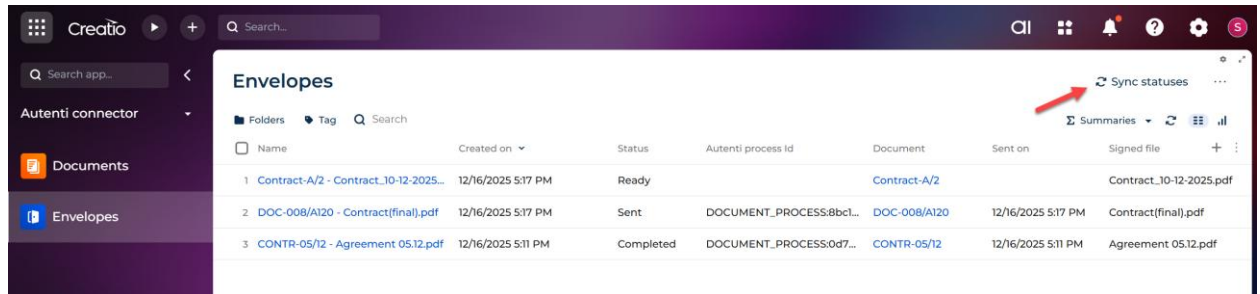

2. Click **Send to participants**. The file is uploaded to Autenti as a draft and then sent to the participant's email for e-signature.

## 4.5 TRACK STATUS IN CREATIO

1. Open the **Envelopes** section.



2. Click **Sync statuses** to refresh the status of all envelopes.
